
Vietnam Veteran's Day is commemorated on August 18 each year and this year was the 60th anniversary of Australians involvement in Vietnam. Australian soldiers fought valiantly and sadly this battle involved the greatest casualties of Australian lives during the Vietnam war.

The Women's Auxiliary offered to run a Commemorative dinner on behalf of the RSL Committee, a revival of a traditional dinner hosted by the Beaumaris RSL from 1988 till our closure in 2015

With guest speaker, John Silvester, and our MC for the night Terry Black, it was a night to remember. Thank you to the Auxiliary members who worked tirelessly to ensure the success of the night and the 164 attendees had a thoroughly enjoyable evening. Proceeds from this event will go to support veterans and their families.

Rob Roy McIntosh 19.03.1925 - 07.08.2022 enlisted in the Royal Australian Navy on 17 March 1943, 2 days before his 18th birthday. After his initial training at HMAS Cerberus and a month at HMAS Lonsdale, he joined the crew of the N Class Destroyer HMAS Napier in which he served until 5 November 1945.

By the time Roy joined the ship she had moved from the Mediterranean to the Indian Ocean, and was active round Mombasa, Aden and India. By 24 February they were based at Trincomalee in North Eastern Ceylon (Now Sri Lanka), then on to the Bay of Bengal. In May 1944 the ship called at Exmouth Gulf to and from a raid on Surabaya. By this time, they were joined by 4 American ships, the largest being USS Saratoga.

After a refit at Williamstown and a well-earned 30-day break for the crew, Napier joined the British Eastern Fleet, during which time they were assisting the Army bombarding Japanese positions along the Mayu Peninsula in Burma.

Roy or Mac as he was called in the Navy was an Ack Ack gunner and in an armchair chat with Neal Stewart, he said that when they were under heavy attack by Zeros "I'd harness myself into the Oerlikon, knees shaking like hell ... out of excitement I suppose and say to myself

'You're the Gunner, they're relying on you!" The nearest bomb was 4 Feet off their starboard bow and luckily did not explode.

Napier was the first ship into the harbour when Akyab Island was retaken from the Japanese in January 1945 and assisted the Army with its landing at Myebon, fifty miles from Akyab. Then on to Ramree with Capital ships to assist.

Napier then went off to join the British Pacific Fleet which joined the American navy operating in the Philippines, Okinawa and the Formosa Islands (now known as Taiwan). Here they were faced with floating mines and Kamikazes, not to mention cyclones and typhoons. It was Mac's job to sink the floating mines. He lost count of how many he blew up. During this stint of duty, they were 70 days without stepping onto dry land.

The war was coming to an end by now. The morning after the second Atomic bomb was dropped on Nagasaki they were sailing north east when they passed through a strange dark cloud hugging the sea. It has since been confirmed that it was some of the fallout from that bomb. I guess Mac was lucky he was wearing antiflash gear.

Roy was very proud of the fact that their Captain H J Buchanan was the First Commonwealth Officer ashore after the surrender and took control of the huge Yokosuka Naval Base near Yokohama.

Their ship was the lead Fleet destroyer which Roy was very proud about. He was very proud of the fact that they were in Tokyo Bay for the surrender.

He was demobilised on 17 April 1946.
