Building up the membership of the Beauy RSL with Service, Affiliate and Social members over the next 12 months is a key objective.



Our new permanent home




The Sub-Branch has entered into a 50-year lease agreement with the Black Rock Sports Club providing the key benefits below and much, much more:

- -Sub-Branch members access to the facility
- -ANZAC and Remembrance Day functions
- -Partnering with BRSC on social nights/lunches
- -Upgraded accommodation with disability design
- -Permanent Womens Aux Heathland Day club
- -Every Wednesday is RSL night

State Branch supported a simple rental with no on-costs to the Sub-Branch using a 12-year pre-payment to fund the building works. This payment comes directly from the Sub-Branch land sale proceeds that are invested within the Beaumaris Patriotic Building Patriotic Fund.

Building Refurbishment Project



A sub-committee was established in 2021 with members of the BRSL and BRSC committees to develop an agreed floor plan layout to accommodate the Sub-Branch and complete the necessary building works. Completing the floor plan and gaining approval by both committees was a 12-month project starting with the procurement of a suitably qualified architect. After considerable assessment Wilko Doehring was appointed who is also a local resident of Beaumaris.

Wilko worked very hard with the committee and after a number reiterations from feedback from members, the floor plan was approved. The layout forms a major part of our Lease and thus only very minor changes can be made. It should be noted that it is expected that the refurbishment will proceed in stages to ensure the club can keep trading and the project kept within budget.

The sub-committee now moves into progressing the refurbishment needing to secure a builder, supporting specialists, complete documentation and establishing a building management plan. The expected date to start works is Feb/March with a December 2024 completion date.

We aim to keep members informed through meetings (we held our 1st information meeting in September) the newsletter and our new social media accounts.

Merchant Mariners officially voted as affiliate members



The Point Danger **Monument to Merchant Mariners** Officially dedicated on the 3rd Sep 2017 by The former Governor of Queensland, his Excellency Paul de Jersey A.C.

It was very pleasing at the 2023 State Conference the below motion (with discussion) to change the membership categories to include Merchant Mariners as Affiliate Members was conducted. One of our very active members Jim Dalgleish (a Service Member) spent many decades at sea in Merchant Ships as a Marine Engineer. This included trips to Vietnam during the War.

Jim also lost his uncle Radio Officer, Benjamin Park Dalgliesh (39 years old) in WW2 when the British Steam Merchant Ship Navasota was sunk on the 5th of Dec 1939 on its voyage from Liverpool to Capetown. The German Submarine U-47 commanded by the famous skipper Gunther Prien attacked at 1440hrs with a single torpedo. His uncle and the skipper made it to a life raft but were found dead making a total of 36 lost. 37 crew were picked up by HMS Escapade and Merchant ship *Clan Farquhar and then landed at Capetown.

In Australian waters 41 Allied Naval and Merchant Ships were sunk during WW2 while transporting vital supplies for Australia and deployed forces with hundreds of sailors losing their lives. Many were unescorted and essentially sitting ducks.

*At time of writing the Clan Farquhar involved in the rescue is disputed by other evidence she was sunk 22 years earlier on the 22/2/1917 during WW1 by another submarine UB-43 80 miles north-east of Benghazi. 49 persons were killed. Read more at wrecksite: https://wrecksite.eu/wreck.aspx?58046. If we have any researchers who can solve this dastardly confusion, please send us your investigation report for publishing!

The memorial at Point Danger QLD includes a Walk of Remembrance with a plaque for every sinking including a number of ships lost off Victorian shores. USS City of Rayville was lost early in the War on the 8th of November 1940 as a result of a German Raider laid sea mine off Cape Otway. It was these acts at sea that brought the war very close to home.



One of Australia's largest sea tragedies was the loss of the Australian Hospital Ship Centaur which had been converted at the start of the war from a Passenger Liner. She was fully marked with the international sign of a Red Cross and on its second voyage from Sydney to New Guinea. The Japanese Commander of the Submarine No. 1-177 at 4.10am on the 14th of May 1943 made the decision to send torpedoes into the hull of this unarmed, large (3066 Ton) and defenseless ship only 40 nautical miles off Stradbroke Island.

She had 332 non-combatant personal aboard made up of 75 Merchant Navy crew, 65 ships Army Medical Staff including 12 female Nurses and 192 members of the 2/12th field Ambulance tasked to set up land medical units. 268 lives were lost as the ship sank in only 3 minutes.

The RAAF Avro-Anson Patrol Aircraft from 71Squadron based at Lowood QLD sighted survivors clinging to life rafts and debris the next day 15th of May at 2pm. The near-by USS Mugford received a signal to head immediately to the area and after 34 hours in the water picked up 64 survivors including the sole Nurse to live through this disaster Sister Ellen Savage.

13.9 Rule Remit 8 of 8 - Rokewood Sub-Branch - Affiliate Members

That the rules of the branch be amended, as per the below changes. Rules affected: 5.11 Affiliate of the Branch Amend existing Rule 5.11 (e) (6) Rule 5.11 (e) (6) amend to read: "...or a person who is, or has been, a member, for at least 6 months, of one of the following: A State or Federal Police Force; An Ambulance Service or Brigade; A Fire Brigade or Fire Authority; A State Emergency Service; A Bronze Medallion member of a Surf Life Saving Club; A Corrections/Prisons Officer; or A member of the commonwealth or allied Merchant Navy."

The Chair put the motion forward.

Inverloch Sub-Branch seconded the motion.

The Chair sought discussion from participants.

Discussion

Pam Bailey from Rokewood Sub-Branch opened the debate by explaining that the Merchant Navy march with the Navy on ANZAC Day and that they are the next best thing to a serviceman. It's about time that they were recognised.

Legal Representative Elizabeth Edwards intervened and explained that the rule displayed on the screen was incorrect and that 5.11 (e) (6) was the correct rule to be discussed.

Greg Mead from Phillip Island Sub-Branch opposed the remit. He argued that in 1968 the Sun Newspaper interviewed members of the Merchant Navy on the Jeparit who stated that they were on the ground in Vietnam witnessing Australian troops doing atrocious things to the people in Vietnam in an attempt to turn the public against them.

Clarke Martin from Beaumaris Sub-Branch spoke in favour of the remit explaining that he spoke to a crewman on the Jeparit who had a very different experience to the one outlined bythe Sun newspaper of the day.

David Westphalen from Mansfield Sub-Branch spoke in favour of the remit. David's grandfather died on the SFI Crown when it was sunk. 35 men died on that vessel. That is sufficient reason to be considered eligible.

Stephen Hayes from Woorinen Sub-Branch - Bronze medallions from Surf Life Saving Clubs are accepted, anyone can get a Bronze Medallion. James Steedman from Caulfield Sub-Branch argued that there should be some parameters around the Maritime service and that there should be caution around letting latter day Maritime ervice people into the organisation.

Pam Bailey from Rokewood Sub-Branch closed the debate by explaining that bronze medallions, prison guards are currently accepted, we have no idea where they are from, they are not connected to service.

Vero Vote: 196 voted in favour 54 voted against Margin of 78.4%

The Chair declared the remit Carried, Outcome: Approved

A good question

Our Vice President John Douglas OAM was provoked into action recently when he came across a Dutch made safety marine product advertised on-line. He posed the question to the Sub-Branch members informally known as the 'Marine Section'. What is dramatically wrong with this Starboard Side Light?



After considerable discussion, written feedback and reflection our VP, has formed the belief the lens should be blue not green which is the international recognised colour of Starboard (Right Hand Side of a vessel as you look forward) and also provided a response regarding the Arc of Visibility that appeared to be a little too wide. Below is the VP determination:

An oil lamp has a yellow flame. An electric light gives a yellow light. Yellow and blue make green. A Mickey Mouse El Cheapo lamp may have green glass and it will appear green over a short distance, however it is quite anaemic and appears white as the range increases. The arc of visibility for a single sidelight is from right ahead to two points abaft the beam. IE 90° from right ahead to the beam plus 2 points @ $11 \frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ per point = $22 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ Plus the 90° = $112 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$

Add the arc of the Port side light and we have a total of 225° for the two side lights. Subtract that from 360° and we have the arc of visibility of the Stern or Overtaking Light. IE 135°

We thank our VP for raising this important maritime matter and do hope the manufacturers can respond in time
